





This conference focuses on improving care and outcomes for people with Chronic Kidney Disease and implementing the Updated NICE Quality Standard released in July 2017. Chaired by Jonathan Hope, a CKD Patient and Patient Leader, the conference will demonstrate how to improve practice against the new quality statements.
